Those with an eye for vintage style will Soho House's reimagining of Sir Edwin Lutyens's Midland Bank building, in the heart of the Square Mile. # DEVON

After 21 years and two Michelin stars at Gidleigh Park, Michael Caines wanted a new challenge. At Lympstone Manor, his country house near Exeter, the decor will be as modern and original as the dishes. The rooms will have a New England feel and there'll be tasty views over the Exe estuary from the three dining rooms. Opens in April; doubles from £245, B&B; lympstonemanor.co.uk

If walls could talk, Beaverbrook's would surely scandalise. The neoclassical party pad outside Leatherhead is where Max Beaverbrook, the first baron of Fleet Street, entertained the great and good when they were being bad — particularly Winston Churchill. The chocolate heir Joel Cadbury bought the place in 2010 and recruited the former Lime Wood director Justin Pinchbeck and the Soho House designer Susie Atkinson to add House designer Susie Arkinson to add contemporary cred to its high-powered history. You can already stay in the Garden House, but the House's 18 rooms are the prize: they should be splendid. The House opens in spring; Garden House doubles from £280; beaverbrook.co.uk

# LAKE DISTRICT

Watergate Bay was the Cornish hideaway that made family action holidays cool: now the team are heading north to unveil the Lake, with Ullswater replacing the Atlantic for high-octane watersports, and an 18th-century Cumbrian pile providing 40 folksy rooms.

### COGNAC

Tony Conigliaro is the king of the conceptual cocktail: his Michelin-worthy mixology has been the downfall of many a guest at London's Zetter Townhouses. Now he's branching out: details are sketchy, but centre on a bar with louche rooms by the River Charente, opposite the Hennessy distillery. Should be tasty. Opens in summer; room rates TBC; the drink factory. com thedrinkfactory.com

# FORMENTERA

The lack of an airport has saved this baby Balearic island from the tourist hordes, and the reinvention of the Gecko by Pablo Carrington, Spain's coolest hotelier, will make the half-hour ferry ride from Ibiza well worth the effort. It's all about barefoot luxury: the interiors are white on white, with a splash of cobalt blue, leaving the Gecko's sparkling strip of Migjorn beach to do the talking.

## MARRAKESH

Jasper Conran has created womenswear, menswear, homeware, accessories, fragrance and, finally, a hotel. His 19th-century riad, L'Hôtel, has a 1930s vibe: the five suites are decorated with antiques and art from the designer's personal collection, and there's a communal pool, a rare and welcome plus in the steamy medina.

# **NEW YORK**

Even jaded New Yorkers cannot wait for Hotel Brooklyn Bridge to "sprout" this place is way too organic simply to open. Local artists have used native greenery for sculptures, and the 194 rooms have hemp-blend mattresses and chunks of reclaimed wood as furniture. There's a lobby farmstand stocked by artisanal producers and a "yappy hour for visiting pooches. There's also a

### CAMBODIA

The islands off Sihanoukville are the Maldives on steroids: same glorious diving and Crusoe-esque coves, but with tropical forests and Khmer culture. Alila Koh Russey's high-concept villas will have glass walls and wow-factor infinity pools that are a match for the Indian Ocean's finest, but at about half the price Opens in May; doubles from £232, B&B; alilahotels.com

### CAPE TOWN

It won't just be the most exciting hotel in Africa: it'll be the most exciting building, too. The Silo is the star British designer Thomas Heatherwick's conversion of a historic grain store on the V&A Waterfront — the brief was to create 28 lust-worthy rooms within the elevator house, then, for an encore, turn the exterior into Africa's answer to the Eiffel Tower. He has done so by introducing pillowed window panels that glow like a lantern in the dark. Cranking up the cachet, the lower floors will house the Zeitz Museum of Contemporary Art Africa, which opens in September. Opens in March; doubles from £700, B&B; theroyalportfolio.com
